People in society, Economy and Business

Children are taught about how societies function.

Children are taught about their rights and how to respect the rights of others. They learn about the difference between needs and wants.

Children are taught about the importance of showing consideration for others and explaining reasons for actions. As they move through the school they will learn the effects discrimination can have on people and societies.

Children learn about:

- communities and how the needs of others can be met/supported
- current social, economic or political issues
- diversity of cultures and values in our society
- decision making, democracy and the rights and responsibilities of citizens in Scotland

Why teach Social Studies?

Children will have the opportunities to learn about Social Studies in a variety of contexts. These can take the form of an interdisciplinary project or topic which spans across various areas of the curriculum.

Throughout Social Studies activities, children will:

- develop their understanding of the history, heritage and culture of Scotland, and their place in the world
- broaden their understanding of the world by learning about people in the past and present
- deepen their understanding of their own values, beliefs and cultures and those of others
- learn about citizenship and democracy and have opportunities to share their thinking and opinions
- explore and link people and events in time and place
- consider different forms of evidence and sources of evidence
- develop an understanding of concepts that stimulate enterprise and influence business



What will my child experience?

The 3 areas Social Studies covers are:

- People. past events and societies
- People, place and environment
- People in society, economy and business

People, Past Events and Societies

In this area children will learn about:

- types of evidence and sources of information and as they move through the school they will learn about trustworthy sources
- similarities and differences between their own lives and the lives of those in the past
- the importance of significant historical events or figures and how they have influenced life today

Some examples of the contexts your child may learn about in school are:

- Toys Childhood History
- Romans
- Scottish Heritage
- Mary Queen of Scots



People, Place and Environment

This area includes context such as:

- nature and how to care for the environment
- natural disasters and the effects these have on the world
- landscape of their local area and beyond and how landscapes are formed
- international Education Countries around the world
 including physical and cultural
 aspects. The children will have
 opportunities to look at
 maps/atlases
- travel and transport
- communities and facilities including different types of housing etc
- weather and climate and changes in seasons including the effect this has on living things
