# Keeping Our Children Safe When Using the Internet

Internet safety is an integral part of our Health and Wellbeing programme. In addition to this, the following advice is given by West Lothian Council.

West Lothian Education Service implements software to provide protection from inappropriate material on the internet without impending the acquisition of information. It must be recognised, however, that no protection can be absolutely guaranteed and, to this end, children must not actively seek inappropriate material and should any items which make them feel uncomfortable.



We have set out some internet rules for children to help minimise the possibility of accessing inappropriate material or communications. We shall explain these rules to each child before they access the Internet. We ask that you read these rules, for your own information, and also discuss them with your child.

### Responsible Use Rules for Children

When I use ICT and the Internet, I agree that:

- I will not try to find material that could be considered inappropriate.
- I will not use ICT or the Internet in such a way that will disrupt its use by others.
- I will tell a member of staff if I find a page, picture or message that makes me feel uncomfortable.
- I will not communicate my address of phone number, or those of others.
- I will not post or send any messages or pictures which will make others feel threatened or uncomfortable.
- I will not post or send pictures of myself or others on the Internet or via email.
- I will remember that emails are not guaranteed to be private.
- I will not swear or use rude or threatening words.

If I do not follow these rules, I understand that I may not be allowed access to the internet and the school may take further action.
